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
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- 1) Cut out and score parts of 1A and 2.
- 2) Cut out 3A. Remove the slit meant for the DVD tray on 3A. Cut out the circle where the power on button lies. Cut out 3B and 3C. Remove the shorter part of 3C as well as the central portion and connect the remaining length of 3C such that it forms a conical structure. Cellophane tape would hold 3C together well. Assemble 3B and 3C by pasting 3B onto the smaller circle on 3C. Take the whole structure (3B + C) and paste it on the inside of the circular hole that you made on 3A. The power on button is complete now.
- 3) Cut out 4A and 4C, removing the appropriate white portions. Now, paste them back to back. Cut out 4B and paste it's borders on the inner, bottom corner of 4A. Paste ONLY the border, because 4B is meant to form a slit to hold the miniature DVD game. Now take the structure (4A + B + C), slide it throught the slit made on 3A. Cut out and paste 4E perpendicular to the white tab on 4A, so that it prevents the disc tray from flopping left and right by supporting itself on the inside walls of the paper Xbox 360. Cut out 4D, colour it with a metallic silver marker to make it shiny and paste it appropriately over the CD tray to form the cover.
- 4) Now take the face plate made from 3A, and all adjoining parts, including the disc tray and fit it onto 1A. Paste 2 to form the back of the Xbox 360.
- 5) Cut out 1B and paste it onto the top of the main piece.
- 6) Cut out 1C, colour it entirely with metallic silver marker, wrap it around 1B and cut off its extra length.
